A teacher is a friend, philosopher and guide who holds our hand, opens our mind and touches our heart. The contribution of a teacher cannot be ignored at all. Teaching is the most influential and responsible job in the world. Teachers are known to shape the mind of youth as without good character and attitude no one can exist in this world. Teachers impart good values in students and turn them into responsible citizens. So, almost every country celebrates Teachers' Day. In India, we celebrate this day on the birthday of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. He was a man of many good qualities and a favourite teacher among students. It was his request that his birthday should be celebrated as a day to honour all the teachers in the country.

Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan (5 September 1888 – 17 April 1975) was an Indian philosopher and statesman who was the first Vice President of India (1952–1962) and the second President of India from 1962 to 1967. Radhakrishnan was honoured with several awards during his life, including a knighthood in 1931, the Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award in India, in 1954, and honorary membership of the British Royal Order of Merit in 1963. Radhakrishnan believed that "teachers should be the best minds in the country". Since 1962, his birthday is celebrated in India as Teachers' Day on 5th September.



Seminar on Waste Management

India's urban population of 429 million citizens produces a whopping 62 million tonnes of garbage every year. Out of this, 5.6 million tonnes is the plastic waste, 0.17 million tonnes is the biomedical waste, 7.90 million tonnes is hazardous waste and 15 lakh tonnes is e-waste. A staggering figure of forty-three million tonnes of Solid Waste is collected annually, out of which only 11.9 million that is 22-28% is treated, while about 31 million tonnes of waste is left untreated and dumped at the landfill sites.

India faces major environmental challenges associated with waste generation and inadequate waste collection, transport, treatment and disposal. Current systems in India cannot cope with the volumes of waste generated by an increasing urban population, and this impacts the environment and public health. The challenges and barriers are significant, but so are the opportunities. Waste segregation at source and use of specialized waste processing facilities to separate recyclable materials has a key role. Waste collection is the responsibility of the municipal corporations in India, and bins are normally provided for biodegradable and inert waste. Mixed biodegradable and inert waste is often dumped, with open burning a common practice. Waste collection, storage and transport are essential elements of any SWM system and can be major challenges in cities. Disposal of residual waste after extraction of material resources needs engineered landfill sites and/or investment in waste-to-energy facilities. The potential for energy generation from landfill via methane extraction or thermal treatment is a major opportunity, but a key barrier is the shortage of qualified engineers and environmental professionals with the experience to deliver improved waste management systems in India. Plastic waste can be recycled and used in road making. Lack of Awareness and Enforcement is a major problem. The solid waste management rules of 2016 has made waste segregation mandatory for every waste generator be it an individual, community, society or an corporate office, but implementation remains poor.

Mr. Saikesh Paruchuri, an entrepreneur and crusader of Swach Bharath, who worked in coordination with Tenali town municipality and adopted the town to implement his project on waste management was invited to give a seminar on 23rd September. He presented a video on how his project was carried out. He interacted with the faculty members on various aspects and doubts regarding waste management. He suggested that one day in a month can be ear marked for Swach Bharath Abhiyaan.



My Dream Campus - Career Guidance programme

The Career Development cell of ATRI organized a career guidance programme on "Higher Education Abroad" on 9th September in collaboration with My Dream Campus Organisation. Inspiring Personality - M.S. Subbulakshmi

Madurai Shanmukhavadivu Subbulakshmi (16 September 1916 – 11 December 2004), also known as M.S., was a renowned Carnatic vocalist. She was the first musician ever to be awarded the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour. She is the first Indian musician to receive the Ramon Magsaysay award, Asia's highest civilian award. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru had this to say about M.S. Subbulakshmi- "Who am I, a mere Prime Minister before a Queen, a Queen of Music". The great national leader and poet Sarojini Naidu called her "Nightingale of India". Her many famous renditions of bhajans include the chanting of Bhaja Govindam, Vishnu sahasranama (1000 names of Vishnu), Hari Tuma Haro and the Venkateswara Suprabhatam (musical hymns to awaken Lord Balaji early in the morning). She was honoured as a resident artist of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams.

Industrial Visit – CSIR-NGRI

Student : Arepu Kotappa Sairam (148410137) IV-I-A, CE The laboratories and observatories at NGRI were kept open for public on the occasion of CSIR-NGRI Foundation Day.

1. AIRBORNE GEOPHYSICS:

We had a first-hand account of how earthquakes can be measured and monitored at laboratories and observatories and they also observed HELIBORNE GROUNDWATER EXPLORATION STUDIES being carried out at CSIR-NGRI. The advantage of this study is that survey covers more area in less time.



2. GAS HYDRATES:

Exploration completely depends on SIR (Soil Investigation Report). Based on the investigation report, identification of gases is carried out. 90% success rate is observed in the exploration studies till date. The techniques include creation of artificial earthquakes and thereby analyzing reflectance parameters. Seismic data processing techniques include Tomograph, CDR (Call Detail Record). This process cannot be carried out in liquid materials. Use of geophones or seismophones for creating earthquakes. "Use our natural resources (minerals,oil, natural gas, water) meticulously."

3. GROUND WATER:

"WE ARE LOOKING FOR WATER".

Transient Electromagnetic method is being used for Exploration of water. SEISMIC OBSERVATORY: The following are the highlights of the Observatory,

Our beautiful planet Earth's interior is divided into three parts:

Crust Mantle and Core

The movement of the planes can be in various ways viz.,

1. towards each other (Convergent) 2. away from each other (Divergent) 3. as if rubbing each other (Slip/friction). The mechanism can be termed as Plate Tectonics and the movement will be along Normal fault plane, Reverse fault plane. Most of the posters displaying Do's and Don't's during an earthquake, Seismic vulnerability in India were exhibited.

4. TSUNAMI:

Andaman-Myanmar zones are much prone to Tsunami. Tsunami is a secondary disaster resulting from the primary disaster, Earthquake or Landslide. Since tsunamis can cause massive destruction, a lot of investment has been made into tsunami early warning systems. Some of these systems use:

- 1. Buoys floating in the ocean
- 2. Satellites
- 3. After detection of the waves, the information has to be disseminated among the affected population.

Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering

Ayudha Pooja

Ayudha Pooja is an integral part of the Navratri festival (festival of triumph), a Hindu festival which is traditionally celebrated in India. It is also called "Astra Puja", the synonym for Ayudha Puja. In simple terms, it means "Worship of Instruments". The festival falls on the ninth day or Navami of the bright half of Moon's cycle of 15 days in the month of September/October, and is popularly a part of the Dasara or or Durga Puja. On the ninth day of the Dasara festival, weapons and tools are worshipped.

Ayudha pooja was conducted by EEE Department on 23rd september to all the labs in the EEE department. The labs include Electrical and Electronics lab, Electrical Machines lab, Electrical Measurements lab, Power Electronics lab, Control system lab, and Electrical Circuits lab.

Industrial Visit

Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) owned and founded by the Government of India, is an engineering and manufacturing company based in New Delhi, India. Established in 1964, BHEL is India's largest power plant equipment manufacturer. It was granted the prestigious Maharatna (big gem) status in 2013 by Govt of India for its outstanding track record and vast scale of operations.

The department of EEE visited BHEL, Lingampally on 11/9/2017 for a one day industrial tour. During the visit students were taken to different sections (Electrical and Mechanical sections) inside BHEL. The visit to electrical department gave students an insight into different alternator's design.

Core winding design and assembly

- Armature slot cutting through lathe machines.
- Laminated stator assembly
- Different types of insulators used and many more.
- Turbine design and assembly.
- Types of turbines.
- Types and shapes of blades and vanes and their design methods.

Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering

Workshop

The department of ECE in association with SCIENTECH Technologies organized "Hands On Experience on Spectrum Analyser "for the faculty on 8th sept, 2017 by Mr. Kiran .A spectrum analyzer measures the magnitude of an input signal versus frequency within the full frequency range of the instrument.

The primary use is to measure the power of the spectrum of known and unknown signals. By the spectra of electrical signals, dominant frequency, power, distortion, harmonics, bandwidth, and other spectral components of a signal can



be observed that are not easily detectable in time domain waveforms. These parameters are useful in the characterization of electronic devices, such as wireless transmitters.

The display of a spectrum analyzer has frequency on the horizontal axis and the amplitude displayed on the vertical axis. To the casual observer, a spectrum analyzer looks like an oscilloscope and, in fact, some lab instruments can function either as an oscilloscope or a spectrum analyzer. It helped faculty to make labs more interesting for students by demonstrating different outputs on a single device.

Seminar on "Upgradation Of Technical Labs"

SINCOM Technologies an ISO 9001:2008 Certified Company, pioneers in the manufacturing of Electronics Educational Trainer Kits and Equipments since 1995 has conducted a Seminar on "Upgradation Of Technical Labs" for the faculty of ECE on 14th September, 2017 from 11:00am to 1:00pm. Various modern equipments like Miller Sweep Generator, bootstrap Generator, Current Timebase Generator ,UJT as a Relaxation Oscillator, Astable Multivibrator, Monostable Multivibrator, Phase Locked Loop, Voltage Regulator using IC723, Regulator using IC78XX, IC79XX series, Schmitt Trigger, Logic gates using IC's, Automatic Gain Control, Frequency Multiplier, Different Multiplexing Modules, Integrator, Differentiator , Adder, Subtractor and kits performing various modulation techniques designed to educate students about the problems and trouble shooting techniques that are supposed to be adopted when exposed to advanced working systems in the industries were demonstrated which helped faculty members to understand new technologies and implement them for the development of students.


